Kayenta Township Completes 2.6 Million Dollar Wetherill Heights Project



Nov. 30, 2012

KAYENTA, Ariz. — Wetherill Heights located within the Kayenta Township has had to deal with flooding issues that has affected roads, local residents, infrastructure, and schools. For years the Wetherill Heights community suffered poor conditions after micro-bursts of continuous rainfall and snow that caused hardships for the resident's, homes and yards. However, Kayenta Township

stepped up to help resolve the problem and utilizing local tax dollars began looking into how to resolve the road and flooding issues. The Township with the help of BITCO-Kitchell of Albuquerque NM, initiated the process of putting together construction documents and a plan to remedy the situation. The road project commenced in Late 2012 - and entailed road stabilization, soil cement and chip sealing along with the addition of 5 deten-

tion basins which is designed to capture run-off from the roadways and to reduce the speed of water, therefore reducing the amount of erosion adjacent to home-sites and

schools downstream from the project. Gabriel Yazzie, department manager for the Kayenta Township Construction and Developments Department,

says the project was the result of concerns expressed from the community. Andre Cordero, the Township manager, explains that “The Wetherill Heights Road Improvements and Drainage project truly improved the Quality of Life for Kayenta Residents. The finished \$2.6 million project was paid for by our local Tax dollars and was completed in November of 2013. With the completion of the project, community members will now have improved and

Insight into Kayenta Township

December 28, 2014

KAYENTA, Ariz.- The Kayenta Township has functioned as a governing authority and effective unit of local government within the Navajo Nation for 28 years. It is the only "township" formally established under Navajo Nation law. It is unique and operates as a city-type government with "Home Rule" authorities.

The Township is governed by an elected five-member Kayenta Township Commission ("KTC").

Current Commissioners include Carol Todecheene

(Chairperson), Dolores Greyyeyes (Vice Chairperson), Roger Grey (Treasurer/Secretary), Ed Seaton and JoDonna Hall-Ward. The Commissioners serve a staggered term of four years and are subject to the Kayenta Election Ordinance as well as the Navajo Nation Election Code. The Kayenta Township is managed by Andre Cordero (Town Manager), and the Township has approximately +/-20 employees.

In approving the Home Rule status of the Kayenta Township, the Navajo Nation Council granted the KTC "jurisdiction over all area au-

thorized and designated by the Navajo Nation Council in November 1985 (Resolution CN-86-85)... and stated that the "authority of KTC shall prevail over all other authority contingent upon its consistency and compliance with all generally applicable laws and regulations of the federal government and the Navajo Nation." This broad grant of authority is consistent with the concept of "Home Rule," which is limited only by the generally applicable laws and regulations of the federal and Navajo Nation government. ■

When did all this start to move forward?

December 28, 2014

KAYENTA, Ariz.-When Andre Cordero took the Town Manager position in 2011 he knew he had a lot of work to do.

Work had to be done whether it be amending or

clarifying kayenta Township's role as a Self-Governed Community to local Authorities and Agencies, creating zoning and ordinances for the town, collection of taxes, managing budgets, resolving road and residential issues and working with potential

business owners that would further economic growth for the Community.

Andre Cordero stated, "I am the third generation in Kayenta, so I know I have to put 100 percent in everything I do to help the community grow and prosper." ■

LGA Certification vs A Self-Governed Kayenta Township

December 28, 2014

KAYENTA, Ariz.-The Township is a unique form of local government that grants us governmental authority. In order to understand the concept I would like first to touch on how Navajo Nation Chapters become certified under the "Local Governance Act" (LGA) to draw a comparison.

In 1998, the Navajo Nation adopted the LGA concerning how a Chapter can be certified as a local form of government. Through the LGA, the Navajo Nation delegates to Chapters certain governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Law, customs and traditions. This Act clearly defines the execu-

tive and legislative functions of the Chapter as well as the duties and responsibilities of Chapter Officials and administrators consistent with the Navajo Nation's policy of "separation of powers" and "checks and balances".

The Kayenta Township similarly governs with responsibility and accountability to the local citizens. However, it enjoys additional self-governing prerogatives under Navajo law. In 2003, the full Navajo Nation Council established the Township as a "home rule municipality" with broad governmental authorities. Comparisons between certified Chapters and the Kayenta Township can inform local government leaders as to how to govern most effec-

tively for the benefit of the people within their jurisdiction. The Kayenta Township has experienced what works and what does not work through its many years of growth leading to its present success. Indeed, perhaps the greatest benefit of having Township status under Navajo law is that all governmental decisions are made locally. ■

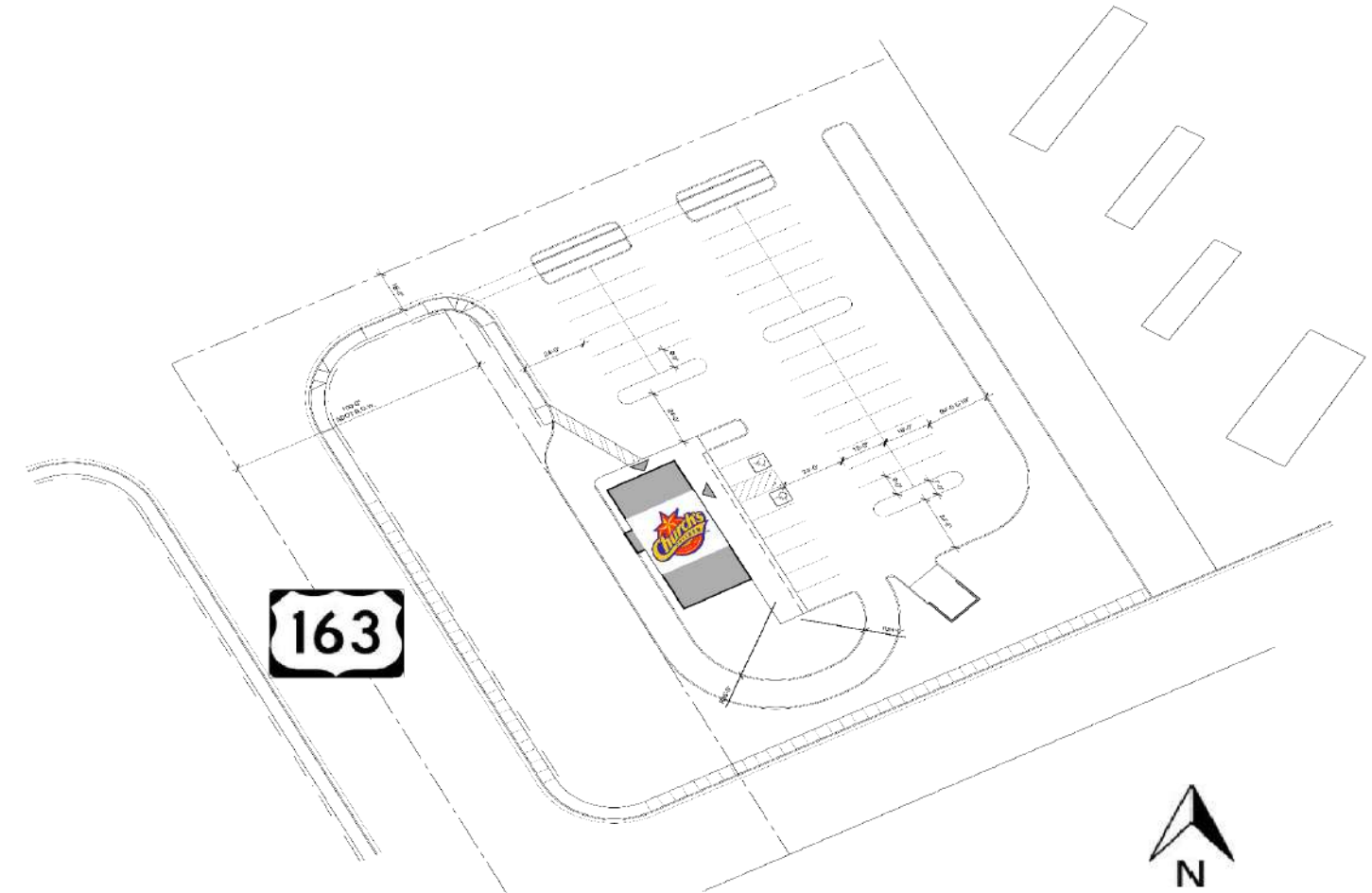
my kids live here. I see Kayenta growing, developing, I would like to further my commitment to this community in regards to economic development here."

Kayenta Ariz.- On December 23, 2013 Community Members, Volunteers, Local & Surrounding Police Departments, Kayenta Volunteer Fire Department, Monument Valley Fire & Rescue, and Kayenta Township, collectively joined forces to help local kids with gifts for Christmas.

Toys for Tots is a nonprofit organization that raises funds for kids/tots whose families cannot afford to buy gifts for Christmas. The organization was founded in 1947 by United States Marine Corps Reservist Major Bill Hendricks.

Watching all the kids that were in line that day, you could see the excitement in their faces waiting to receive their gifts. The amount of families that brought their kids to the event truly surpassed everyone's expectations. The line stretched from the Kayenta Basha's courtyard all the way to the front entryway of subway. Entertainment & music played outside provided by Sage Bond from Cow Springs AZ, set the mood for the event.

This year's toys for tots really did shine for the families in need here in Kayenta and surrounding communities. Lt. Nez from the Criminal Investigations Unit stated that "This year they were able to provide toys for needy kids starting from Sweet Water NM, slowly working their way through Aneth UT, Mexican Water AZ, Dennehotso AZ, Monument Valley AZ, Kayenta AZ, Chinle AZ, Kaibeto AZ, Lachee AZ, Shonto AZ, Inscription House AZ, and a few more rural towns that don't have the economic resources to provide families with jobs. Admission for the event was a brand new toy, non-perishable foods, a new or slightly used jacket or cash at the door. We had an excellent turn out."

The days following Christmas, Toys for Tots was still at it, passing out gifts for some of the rural communities that hardly get the attention they need around the Holidays. Verna Nez said that "Kayenta alone, we had serviced near or over 2000 kids. All the numbers are not in from the surrounding communities but we estimate 6000+ kids received a gift.

The coordinating team and volunteers donated their personal time to make this a successful effort to help those in need.

Kayenta Animal Care Center Spay Neuter Scheduled for January 28th 30th, 2014

January 9, 2014

Kayenta, Ariz-Spay neuter surgery schedule for the month of January: 28th, and 30th. Schedule for February is still pending.

KACC is still awaiting rabies tags for 2014. Rabies vaccination will not be available until further notice and will likely not be available until early February due to a manufacture back log. In the meantime, pet owners may receive no-cost rabies vaccination at Kayenta IHS OEH office. Rabies vaccination through KACC is \$12.00 but includes a KACC rabies tag and Navajo Nation Pet License and tag. Four-way dog and cat vaccines are 12.00 (this includes canine distemper and canine parvo).

Currently, we are seeing a strong spike in Canine Distemper in Kayenta and surrounding communities. This disease is occurring in unvaccinated or insufficiently

vaccinated (puppies receiving only one vaccine and no boosters) dogs and puppies. The symptoms of the disease include upper respiratory infection with coughing, nasal discharge, and/or conjunctivitis with ocular discharge. Dogs become lethargic, stop eating and/or drinking, and exhibit excess weight loss. The disease may progress to neurologic dysfunction causing tremors, head tilt, seizures, abnormal eye movements, etc. At this stage of the disease, death is imminent. All dogs, in this area, should be vaccinated at 5 weeks of age followed by regular booster vaccinations then once yearly thereafter.

The interior and exterior issues were all addressed and the total cost of all improvements, including Labor was approximately \$100,000.00

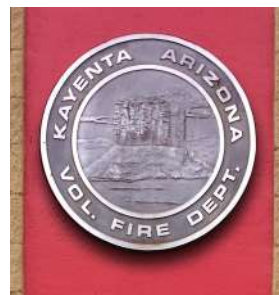

The building was not running as efficiently as it was

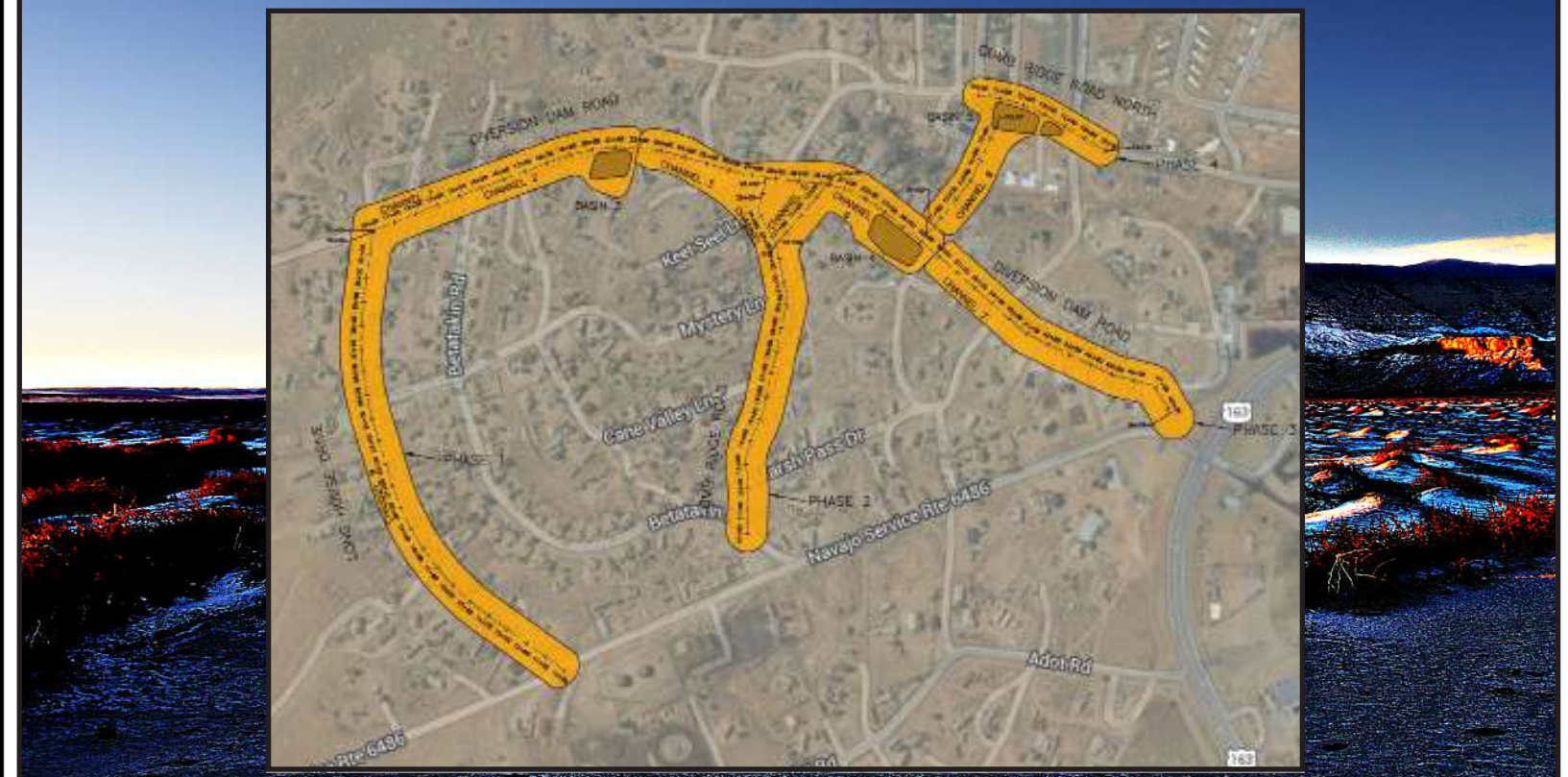
